## **Upper School**


#### **Upper Site News:**

Class 6 This term, during English lessons, class six have been focussing on writing to persuade. They have designed their own products such as drinks, snacks, and shoes, and have developed advertisement campaigns around their products. They chose the genre, audience, and purpose of their products, and then made some amazing posters which are now on display in the classroom (seen in the picture). The next task was to create the concepts, scripts, and storyboards for a TV advert. We got some wild and wacky ideas for their adverts, the visitations of a witch, and a drink being delivered by a giant gecko.

Class 2 started their mock exam practice for maths and science. For history they are completing a presentation.

For Science they have visited the water treatment in Eastbourne so they could learn how the water is treated to become potable.

**Voyagers:** The Voyagers have continued to impress with their dedication and commitment to learning. This term we have worked hard towards our ELC qualifications. In English we have looked at the topics of Hobbies and Charities. Pupils engaged in a persuasive debate about which charity we should fundraise for. In Science we looked at Biology, conducting a heart rate experiment and Physics. In Maths we have looked at Statistics where we found out some of HVS' favourite pizza toppings, cars and takeaways. We have also looked at Calendar and Time. In PSHE pupils have learnt about being in a community and have also been celebrating difference, learning about different disabilities as well as other cultures. In Life Skills pupils have undertaken the Velo Project and a cooking project where they have cooked different meals from around the world. Pupils also learnt some simple phrases in Makaton, including "Hello, we are the Voyagers class".

To kick off Term 2, Class 1 were asked to host the Upper School assembly. After lots of discussion and practice, all the members of the class took part in what can only be described as a spectacular, captivating, and historically accurate reimagining of the Gunpowder Plot. All pupils showed great confidence and took particular pride in their individual roles to provide the rest of the Upper School with a theatre performance for the ages. Special mention the pupil's portrayal of King James I (complete with Scottish accent). This humorous and informative production showed just how much these pupils have grown; willing to stand in front a hall full of people and deliver rehearsed lines with aplomb. Skills like these will doubtless help Class 1 with their future lives, once they finish their exams and leave Hope View School in the summer. Well done!

**Class 5** have had a positive start to their year. Since taking over as their form tutor, they have made both myself and Mr Alex feel very welcomed into the class, and we have enjoyed watching them mature over the first two terms. The pupils are engaged in the form time activities, we discuss national events, local news, their wellbeing and on Fridays take part in a weekly challenge which

#### Lower Site News:

Pupils returned to school very excited to see the new playground equipment had been installed over the summer, we have been raising funds towards this through our Summer Fair's so thank you for attending and contributing.

We have been working hard on raising engagement with reading, all pupils are expected to read at least three times a week at home, when you sign to let the Class Teacher know they have read, they're rewarded with stickers, certificates, something out of the treasure chest and such like – keep up the good work everyone!



Discoverers have enjoyed learning about fact files in English they are designing their own fact file based on their own UK bird of prey. In maths Discoverers have been practicing their multiplication and division becoming faster and recalling them and learning about the number facts around them. In science they have been researching forces and even created their own parachute which they threw out the window! Discoverers have learnt a lot of new skills during our life skills sessions including researching and presenting news topics, planning projects, and experiencing life as a waiter!

Squirrels class have worked hard this term on their English project, advertising a product. They have used persuasive language and catchy slogans to really sell their product. In maths, we have been studying multiplication and division, practising our times tables regularly. Squirrels have thoroughly enjoyed their science learning about forces this term and loved creating parachutes to test out air resistance. Outdoor education has also been a highlight for Squirrels this term and they have enjoyed learning lots of new skills including building shelters, creating fires (safely!) and lots of teamwork.

**Adventurers** have been working hard reading and writing their own Non-Fiction texts following the theme 'Frozen Planet'. They've been inspired by Sir David Attenborough's films and reading about Arctic animals in fact

books. Art lessons have seen the pupils painting and decorating their own beautiful Arctic animal pictures and creating junk models using recycled materials. In maths they have been developing their addition and subtraction skills using higher numbers and applying their times table knowledge to solve multiplication and division problems. In Science pupils have been experimenting with changes of state, taking part in various fun experiments involving solids, liquids and gases.

Look at this amazing example of teamwork during Outdoor Education this term! Adventurers have been fantastic at making dens and especially using natural materials to create tepees.



Badgers class have really enjoyed exploring shape in maths this term. They have had fun creating 2D shapes from straws and playdough and have been busy learning all about the properties of 3D shapes. In English, Badgers class have been focusing on non-fiction reports based on the Arctic and Antarctica and they are very proud to have created their own non-fiction reports on an Arctic animal. Badgers class have been very creative in their art and ICT lessons, creating tealight holders and baubles for the Christmas Fair and making music in ICT. In science, the focus has been on nutrition and the human body. The boys really enjoyed drawing around each other and adding the skeleton and vital organs. Outdoor Education is always one of the highlights of the week, and this term the boys have been learning basic survival skills and have even created some crafty fir cones.
